## LYNETTE AVERILL, PH.D.

ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR OF PSYCHIATRY

## BAYLOR COLLEGE OF MEDICINE

Dr. Lynnette Averill is an Associate Professor of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences at Baylor College of Medicine. She is also a Clinical Research Psychologist at the Michael E. DeBakey VA Medical Center in Houston, Texas. Additionally, she holds an adjunct position at Yale School of Medicine and is involved with the Clinical Neuroscience Division of the VA National Center for PTSD.

Dr. Averill's research focuses on the mental health of veterans and trauma survivors, particularly in areas like PTSD, suicidality, and the effects of rapid-acting glutamatergic-based drugs such as ketamine. She has received numerous awards and honors, including a Fulbright Fellowship.



## ALLISON MOHR BOLEWAR, LMSW

Alison Mohr Boleware, LMSW, is a sixth generation Texan and currently serves as the Director of Policy at the Hogg Foundation for Mental Health and as an Adjunct Assistant Professor at The University of Texas at Austin. She most recently worked as the Government Relations Director at the National Association of Social Workers – Texas and as a Policy Analyst at the Texas Medical Association. Alison started her career as a Policy Fellow for the Hogg Foundation. During the 84th legislative session she served as a Legislative Aide and staffed the House Human Services Committee. Alison is a Licensed Master Social Worker and received her Master of Science in Social Work at the University of Texas at Austin and Bachelor of Arts from Texas A&M University.



## DIANA CHAPA, M.D.

ASSISTANT PROFESSOR OF MEDICINE, DEPARTMENT CHAIR

#### UNIVERSITY OF TEXAS - RIO GRANDE VALLEY

An RGV native and recently relocating to her hometown from Minnesota, Dr. Chapa obtained her MD at the University of Wisconsin Medical School in 1995. She is an assistant professor of Psychiatry at the UTRGV School of Medicine and is double boarded in Psychiatry, and Child and Adolescent Psychiatry. Dr. Chapa completed her Psychiatry internship and residency at the Medical College of Wisconsin, Affiliated Hospitals from July 1995 to June 1998. She then trained in the same institution for a Child and Adolescent Fellowship from July 1998 to June 2000. As Houston Methodist System Director of Psychiatry, Heather provides leadership and strategic direction for the Office of Nursing Service and Quality on nursing and regulatory issues that impacts behavioral health patient care across 8 hospitals in the system. She collaborates with leadership to plan for current and emerging behavioral health care needs for Houston and the surrounding communities.

Prior to becoming a System Director of Psychiatry Heather was Associate Chief of Nursing at the flag ship hospital where she served as Co-Chair for the readmission committee and subject matter expert for falls. For 10 years she leads Nursing operations for a 24-bed inpatient Psychiatric Unit and DSRIP system multi-million-dollar grant program for transitions in care.

Dr. Chung received a Doctor of Nursing degree from Texas Woman's University and is board certified as a Nurse Executive, Advanced. State Senator Nathan Johnson represents almost a million people in Texas's Senate District 16, a commercially and culturally vibrant district that sprawls throughout Dallas County. He is a leading voice on the electrical grid, healthcare, governmental transparency, and criminal justice.

As a member of the Senate Committee on Business & Commerce, Johnson played a crucial role in the 88th session's legislation to address the sufficiency, sustainability, and resiliency of Texas' power generation and distribution systems.
