

## SUMMARY

This September, the Texas Lyceum is pleased to host a leadership conference exploring the political, economic, and environmental intersection of our state's energy industry. Join us in Midland, the unofficial capital of the Permian Basin, for a better understanding of where all forms of our energy come from, how we use them now, and how we might use them in the future. Energy production and consumption are major drivers of the Texas, U.S., and world economies and directly influence global geopolitics. However, most citizens do not fully understand what energy means to their economy, politics, and environment. In Midland, we'll pull back the curtain on these topics while providing attendees the chance to see what the Permian Basin has to offer in its people, culture, and energy production. As business, government, and community leaders, we seek to connect our group with leaders, industry experts, and policy makers to facilitate a robust conversation regarding an essential aspect of modern society that is often taken for granted.

Our conference begins the evening of Thursday, September 9th in downtown Midland overlooking the newly completed Centennial Park, an urban greenspace inspired by two established Texas parks – Discovery Green in Houston and Klyde Warren Park in Dallas. As a welcome to the energy producing capitol of Texas, local Texas Lyceum Alumni (including three former Lyceum Presidents) will share their Lyceum experiences and careers in the Permian Basin. On Friday morning, we'll learn about energy production and consumption in Texas at the nation's largest museum dedicated to the petroleum industry. The Petroleum Club of Midland will host us Friday afternoon, we'll really open things up with conversations about the political, economic, and environmental impacts of energy production and consumption. That evening, conference guests are in for a treat as we experience the longest continuing melodrama in the United States, the internationally-renowned "Summer Mummers," a theatrical event that "you just can't explain...it must be experienced!" On Saturday morning, we will host a Texas Lyceum Directors' meeting at the picturesque ranch of Lyceum Alumnus Betsy Triplet Hurt before embarking on field tours of hydrocarbon, solar, and wind facilities.
